I Believe

Wednesday Evening

I will not soon forget that day in Lubbock, Texas about 35 years ago. It was the windiest day I have ever experienced. I was attending Lubbock Christian College, which at the time, was bordered by a cotton field. Dust from that field turned the sky brown and even obscured the sun from view. It took all my strength to keep from being blown off the sidewalk as I pushed my way across campus to my classes. By the time I trudged back to the dorm at the end of the day, I was grimy and exhausted, wondering why I had chosen to attend college in the Wind Capital of the World.

How can you believe in something you can't see? This question is commonly posed by skeptics regarding the existence of God. My response is two-fold.

First, all of us believe in things we can't see – gravity, magnetic energy, electricity, and *wind*. Why? Because even though we can't see the actual elements, we can see and feel their effects. I had no doubt about the existence of wind that day in Lubbock because I could see the dust blowing and the trees swaying. I could feel the grit in my scalp and taste the dirt in my mouth. I *knew* that wind is real.

Which leads to my second response. When we see the magnificence and complexity of nature around us, how can we *not* believe in a Creator and Sustainer of it all? Paul states it this way in Romans 1:20:

For since the creation of the world, God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse.

We can see the undeniable effects of God in everything around us.

So in spite of whatever hardship or persecution you may be facing today, believe in Him and be "filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls" (1 Peter 1:8-9). Rest peacefully in that assurance of hope.
