Lou was one of the most effective leaders I have ever known. As the president of a state university a number of years ago, he had a vision for where that college could and should be in the distant future, then put into place the necessary steps to reach that goal. Today the university is reaping the benefits of his visionary leadership.

Lou was not a pretentious man, but in his role as president, he had the responsibility and skill to hobnob with the most elite, powerful and influential people in society. Something that set him apart from other leaders, however, is that one would be just as likely to find him stopping to chat with a freshman student on campus, visiting with one of the janitors in the hallway, or taking a young campus minister out to lunch.
