Restoring Our Wounded

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Matthew 5:7

In Alfred Hitchcock's classic movie, *Marnie*, there is a scene where Marnie races across a field on her horse. As they come to a fence, the horse jumps and fails to clear it, crashing to the ground, injured and in great pain. In a panic, Marnie runs to a nearby house, borrows a gun, and shoots the wounded horse, refusing to wait for a vet to come and evaluate the horse's injuries to see if he can be saved.

As a church, how do we react when someone in our midst stumbles and falls, sustaining a spiritually life-threatening injury? Do we take time to assess the situation and do everything in our power to nurse that wounded soul back to spiritual health? Or in our haste to restore purity and order, do we give up on the damaged person, "finish him off," so to speak, and boot him out the door?

The apostle Paul indicates in 1 Corinthians 5 that there are times when the church is compelled to take a strong stand against sinful behavior. But as verse 5 points out, even when extreme measures must be taken, the ultimate goal of those measures is not final removal of a blight, but reconciliation of the wayward one to the Lord and His church. And in 2 Corinthians 2:5-11, we see that even when the outcome appears bleak, that goal can be accomplished through God's healing power.

So as followers of Christ, what will we be known as – a loving group of people who gently restore and care for our fallen ones? Or will we be a band of "trigger-happy" zealots who shoot our wounded at the first sign of trouble? Remember, whatever we do, the world is watching.
