Hope of Going Home

*Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Matthew 5:10*

Several years ago, I read the biography of an American bombardier who was shot down in the Pacific during World War II, then captured by the Japanese and imprisoned in their POW camps for over two years. Louie and his fellow captives were subjected to horrendous abuse at the hands of their captors, suffering through starvation, grueling slave labor, and constant beatings. While the physical torture was brutal, they soon learned that the emotional torment of humiliation and degradation could be just as deadly. Many could not endure the dehumanizing treatment and lost their will to live.

One thing that kept Louie going throughout the entire ordeal was his hope of going home. He kept thoughts of his family and friends in the forefront of his mind, making plans for things he would do with them whenever he got home. He knew that if he ever lost hope, he would not survive.

During the past 2000 years, many Christians have suffered persecution for their belief in Jesus Christ. While most of us in America today have not experienced physical abuse for our faith, we may very well encounter verbal, social, or emotional persecution. It can be tempting to give up and lose the will to live for Him.

One thing that can carry us through persecution is our hope of going home. Jesus promises in Matthew 5:10-12 that those who suffer because of Him will one day receive the great reward of a home in heaven with Him. Those thoughts of home can help us survive until we reach that day of liberation.
