Lord's Supper Meditation

The Tug-of-War – Luke 22:39-44

As humans, all of us have faced that choice between doing what is right or doing what we really want. It's not one of those vague situations where we are trying to discern between good and best, but a clear-cut decision between God's will and our own. It all comes down to this question: Will we obey or not?

Even Jesus, as the Son of God, was not above this tug-of-war. He wrestled with this dilemma in the Garden of Gethsemane just before His arrest. He had known all along that His ultimate purpose on earth was to sacrifice His life for the world. He knew what that would involve and had already forewarned His apostles of what was about to happen. Yet as the time drew near, His strong personal desire to be spared this torture came to the forefront, and in tears and anguish He begged God to save Him from death and find another way to redeem mankind. But there was no other way, so He was forced to decide: Would He obey or not?

"And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death — even death on a cross!" (Philippians 2:8). How did Jesus reach this level of obedience? Hebrews 5:7-9 tells us that obedience is *learned*; it does not come naturally. This passage says that Jesus learned obedience from what He suffered, and in doing so, became the source of eternal salvation for all those who, in turn, obey Him.

Praise God that Jesus chose to obey and give us hope of eternity with Him! Now it's our turn to learn obedience. In choosing to obey, we, like Jesus, may have to give up things that are important to us – something that brings us pleasure, our friends, our family, our job, or even our life. What are you willing to suffer or give up to obey God and receive that precious gift of life?
